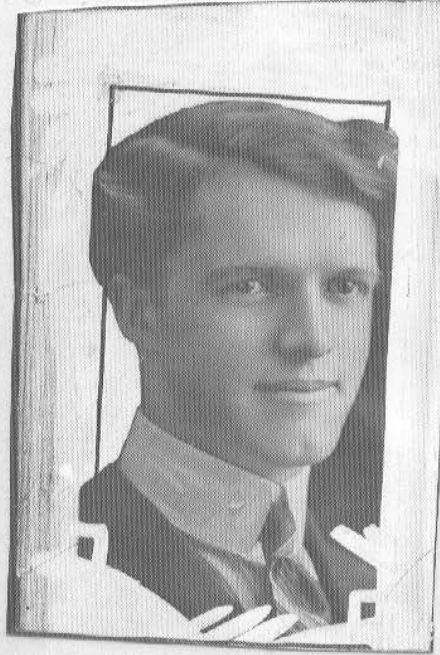


MISS MARIE EVA DE MERS TO WED OSHKOSH MAN.
